

Pastor's Perspective

The season of Lent is drawing near. This is a season of the year in which we mark the 40 days that lead up to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Important to our life as Christians are repentance and forgiveness. While this is important throughout the entire year, there is deeper focus on repentance in Lent. To repent is to turn away not only from our sinful behaviors, but also to turn away from our *sinful nature*. The emphasis on sinful nature is deliberate as it refers to our inherited rebellion against God, which has been handed down from Adam and Eve and has left all of creation broken.

The theme of repentance appears primarily in the New Testament. As the one to prepare the way for Jesus, it is John the Baptist who "... came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" (Matthew 3:1b-2). Jesus will repeat this message following his temptation in the wilderness. As recorded in the Gospel according to St. Matthew 4:17, "From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Repentance is crucial for our life as disciples of Jesus. Repentance starts with recognizing our sin. Recognizing our sin we can then show contrition for our sin, confessing that sin, and making the appropriate changes in our lives so as not to repeat that sin.

Repentance doesn't stop with our apology for sin. This is made clear in the Augsburg Confession. Article XII concerning repentance reads in this way:

"Now properly speaking, true repentance is nothing else than to have contrition and sorrow, or terror about sin, and at the same time to believe in the gospel and absolution that sin is forgiven and grace is obtained through Christ. Such faith, in turn, comforts the heart and puts it at peace. Then

improvement should also follow, and a person should refrain from sins. For these should be the fruits of repentance, as John says in Matthew 3:8: 'Bear fruit worthy of repentance'."

How we worship in the season of Lent reminds us very clearly of our dependence on the grace of God. In fact, going back to the days of the "old Red Hymnal" otherwise known as the Service Book and Hymnal (SBH) there was a rather blunt declaration following the confession of our sins, particularly to those who are unrepentant.

Such declaration to those who are unrepentant and unbelieving is that their sins are not forgiven and that God will visit their iniquity. In other words, there are consequences to our sin. Now, perhaps one might say it was a good thing this paragraph was not included in subsequent hymnals. The danger in that is by not hearing this judgment about our sin, we would not take seriously our need for forgiveness and our dependence upon Christ. In so doing, we also miss out on the incredible joy that is ours through faith.

God meets our repentance with the promise of forgiveness that is accomplished by Jesus Christ. Remember, God does not desire our death. He is merciful to us. The Apostle Paul notes this in Romans 2:4 that "God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance." Such repentance leads to forgiveness and declaration of our justification before God. Christ died for us that we may have life and not suffer the eternal consequences of our sins, namely hell. This work of Christ for us is a free gift as stated clearly again in Romans.

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God." Romans 5:1-2.

In many ways, we forsake that comfort when we treat our sin like just a common cold and fail to repent, failing to receive what Christ so desperately wants to give to us.

This mission comes from Jesus. Christ speaks to the disciples following his resurrection, he offers these words about what we as his followers are called to do.

“Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, ‘Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.’ Luke 24:45-48.

So, I encourage you to keep a holy Lent through repentance and forgiveness. Remember it daily as a gift from God that you are His child. You are so precious before our Heavenly Father that Jesus died for you. Come, hear this good news each week in our worship that you may have peace.
